Rules for Essay Writing

All essays must be at least 3 paragraphs long

Planning Page

- Read the question and count the bullets (or questions)
- Number your planning page based on the bullets
- Steal from each bullet and answer the question
- Write down notes and ideas you will use in your answer
- Each bullet will be a short response inside your essay

Introduction

- Must be at least 3 sentences
- 1st sentence is a steal/claim
- 2nd sentence should be a focus statement and/or a general answer
- 3rd sentence should introduce your points for discussion (think painted essay)

Body

- Use your planning page. Construct complete sentences. Insert details from the text
- Use all elements of good writing- CADD (one detail is good, two is better, three is best), with transition words
- Stay on topic stick to the question

Conclusion

- Must be at least 2 sentences
- Start with Clearly, Obviously, or As you can see and restate your points/claim and answer from introduction
- Include a voice statement I think, I feel, I believe
