GRADES 6TH THROUGH 12TH

I. CONTEST PERIOD

The contest period will end on Friday, March 15, 2024.

II. THEME

What family traits have been passed down from generation to generation in your family that you feel will be your guidelines through life?

III. DEADLINE

All essay submissions must be received no later than March 15, 2024. Submissions received after March 15, 2024, will not be accepted. Essay submissions must be completed and mailed to: Scottish Rite Essay Contest, Utica Masonic Hall, 251 Genesee Street, Utica, NY 13501-3401

IV. LENGTH OF ESSAY

Grades 5 – 8: 150 – 200 words Grades 9 – 12: 200 – 350 words

V. FORMAT

Essays for all grade levels may be typewritten, printed, or neatly hand-written in blue or black ink, double spaced on plain or lined paper, by the applicant.

VI. COVER PAGE

A cover page **MUST** be secured to the essay and contain the following information:

- > Student's Last Name, Student's First Name
- > Name of either Teacher, Parent or Guardian
- > Teacher, Parent or Guardians contact e-mail address
- > Teacher, Parent or contact phone number
- > Teacher, Parent or original Signature
- > Name of School
- > School Address
- > Student's Grade

VII. JUDGING

WORK MUST BE ORIGINAL. Plagiarized material will be disqualified. Research and a bibliography are not required however supportive facts, statements, or data must be footnoted. All essays will be judged by a panel selected by the Committee.
